Announcements: by Debra Mangold. There are few changes in our guild. The first is the resignation of Pam Beck, our quilt show chairperson, due to illness. It is hoped she can rejoin us when she is able. Barbara Whipple has offered to take her place. A meeting was held with the quilt show committee. A new form for entering your quilts into the show will be included in the newsletter. The purpose for the new form is to encourage members to include the name of the person who quilted the entry, if different than the maker of the quilt. The forms are due as soon as possible to facilitate the recording of the quilts. Shirley Speagle Workshop Quilt As You Piece: String Quilt August 8, 2016

Supply List

1. Sewing Machine – *Walking Foot if you have one*
2. Sewing Supplies – *Pins, scissors, thread to match lining fabric*
3. **3** – 12-1/2 inch Cotton Batting Squares
4. **3** – 12-1/2 inch squares of **NON-DIRECTIONAL** lining fabric
5. Lots of 1-1/2 inch wide pieces of fabric (*The more colors and designs – the better*)
6. Rotary cutter and cutting mat
7. 12-1/2” square ruler
8. 18” Long ruler

Cinnamon Coffee Cake Recipe (this is absolutely delicious)

Ingredients:

1 cup butter, softened	2 ¾ cups sugar, divided
4 eggs	2 Teaspoons vanilla extract
3 cups all-purpose flour	1 Teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon salt	2 cups (16 ounces) sour cream
2 Tablespoons ground cinnamon	½ cup chopped walnuts

- 1) In a large bowl, cream butter and 2 cups sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in vanilla. Combine flour, baking soda and salt; add alternately with sour cream, beating just enough after each addition to keep batter smooth.
- 2) Spoon a third of batter into a greased 10-in tube pan. Combine cinnamon, nuts, and remaining sugar; sprinkle a third over batter in pan. Repeat layers two more times. Bake at 350 degrees for 60-65 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool for 15 minutes before removing from pan to a wire rack to cool completely. Yield: 16-20 servings
