## <u>Favorite Recipe from our Luncheon – Cheesecake Lemon Bars</u>

### **Ingredients:**

### **Shortbread Layer**

1 ½ cups plain flour

½ cup powdered sugar

1/4 tsp salt

<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup (6 oz.) unsalted butter, cold and diced into small cubes

### **Lemon Layer**

1 1/2 cups granulated sugar

1 TBS plain flour

1 ½ TBS lemon zest

½ cup lemon juice

4 large eggs

#### **Cheesecake Layer**

2 8 oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened well

3/4 cup granulated sugar

2 large eggs

1 tsp lemon extract

1/4 cup sour cream

### **Sour Cream Layer**

1 cup sour cream

4 TBP powdered sugar

#### **Instructions:**

Preheat oven to 350°. Butter a 13 by 9-inch baking pan, set aside.

**Shortbread Layer** – In a mixing bowl, whisk together flour, powdered sugar, and salt. Using a pastry cutter or fork, cut butter into the flour mixture until it resembles coarse mean. Pour mixture into a prepared baking dish and spread and pat into an even layer. Bake in preheated oven until set, about 15 – 18 minutes. Set aside to cool slightly while preparing fillings.

**Lemon Layer** – In a mixing bowl, whisk sugar and flour, then add in lemon zest, lemon juice and eggs; whish until blended. Set aside (don't pour into crust yet, you don't want it to soak into the shortbread layer while you are preparing cheesecake filling.)

**Cheesecake Layer** – In a mixing bowl using an electric hand-mixer set on low speed, cream together cream cheese and granulated sugar until smooth, about 30 seconds. Mix in eggs, one at a time, and adding in vanilla with the second egg. Mi in ½ cup sour cream. Tap bowl against countertop about 10 times to release any larger air bubbles.

**Pour lemon filling over crust**, then evenly drizzle cheesecake filling by the spoonful over lemon layer (work to evenly distribute as the layers will separate once baked). Skim off any air bubbles. Gently spread cheesecake filling into an even layer. Bake in the preheated oven until filling only jiggles slightly, about 29 to 33 minutes. Remove from the oven and allow to cool at room temperature 45 minutes. Transfer to refrigerator and chill at least 2 hours.

In a small mixing bowl, whisk together sour cream and powdered sugar. Spread into an even layer over the chilled bars. Cut into squares. Store in an airtight container and refrigerate.

\*Cream cheese should be softened until it's nearly melted. This way it's runnier and will make the cheesecake filling easier to drizzle over the top of the lemon layer.

## **Wee Care Therapy Day Information**

For new members who aren't aware of our Wee Care project, here is some information.

We donate baby quilts for Grace Hospital Special Care Nursery. They are 36x36. We supply larger quilts (54x63 approx) to the Morganton Public Safety and Burke County Sheriff's Dept for the officers to carry in their cars to use when comfort is needed. Wee Care Therapy Day is Monday Sept 11, from 9:30 -2:00. On that day you have the opportunity to make quilt kits for members to take home to complete. We will have stations set up to cut and to put kits together. Supplies needed are fabrics, rulers, cutting mats, rotary cutters and scissors. We will provide the fleece cut to the appropriate size for the backs.

For members who want to sew-you are welcome to bring your machine and put quilts together.

If you want to precut fabrics, we use 6.5" cut squares for Wee Care and 9.5" cut squares for police cars. Bring a lunch and stay for as long as you can.

An added bonus: For every quilt you complete, your name is entered in a drawing to be held in Dec.

It comes with several attachments and the original Singer manual. The serial number indicates that it was made in 1951 in Anderson, SC. They were only made for three years. It was Singer's first slant model machine; therefore, Feather Weight attachments do not fit. However, the attachments for this machine are easier to find and much less expensive.
