Minutes from the ZOOM meeting

Zoom meeting was attended by 17 members. Discussed making face masks. Phyllis said she had made over 100 masks. Discussed whether to pay for Zoom yearly or by the month. Nancy suggested paying for it monthly as we need it. Joanne would like to see a project day on Zoom. Augusta Cole has been rescheduled for July. Contact Pat Bell if you need to make changes about this class. JoAnn Estes demonstrated how to find the right side of the batik fabrics by stretching the corner. The fabric will fold toward the wrong side most of the time. Linda had a question about sewing on both edges of rick-rack. it was suggested that she sew down both sides using invisible thread. Judy Cobb shared the info that you need to use a ballpoint needle to sew t-shirt fabric. Mary Stang show an elephant pattern that she was working on. Discussion about our quilt show...need to check with Comma as the date draws nearer to see if they will be open. Joanne- any ideas of things to do during our Zoom meetings. Judy Pearson shared that she has finished her challenge quilt, except for the binding. Judy Cobb suggested that we use Zoom for some show-and-tell. JoAnn Estes said that we need to wait and see how far out we will need to cancel regular meetings. Since schools are closed for the rest of the year, we wondered if that would affect the re-opening of the senior center. JoAnn Estes said that if we are allowed to meet in May, we need to follow social distancing and wear face masks. However, this will probably not happen, since phase 1 limits the number of people meeting together to a max of ten people. Judy Pearson shared that the quilts donated for display at the hospital are still in boxes and are not displayed. Susan is still working with the babies in the hospital. Dinah is still working. There have been 8 deaths at the hospital due to Covid-19. Grace Heights behind the hospital has a lot of cases of Covid-19. Cindy K shared that people are still dropping off quilts for her to quilt. Linda asked participants not to forget that we will still have a craft sale and to be working on those crafts. Joanne said she could possibly teach a project on Zoom. Joanne closed the meeting and stated that she would send out a notification for our next Zoom meeting.
