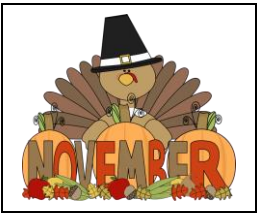
The Christmas pot-luck luncheon is scheduled for Dec 13. Installation of the new officers will occur that day as well.

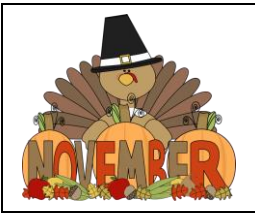
